



1. Ergonomics in seating are extremely important.

Improper seating causes physical pain and possible permanent damage. Less fatigue means more productivity.

More comfort equals less turnover and better morale in the workplace.

In many areas, proper ergonomics are legally required.

2. Ergonomic Chairs are readily available.

Hundreds of ergonomic chairs are made in almost all price ranges. Almost every seating surface can be adjusted to fit almost any human body. As ergonomic technology has improved, chairs have become more and more complicated.

3. Chairs that could be adjusted for perfect fit usually aren't!

Studies indicate that 50% of ergonomic chairs are never properly adjusted but are used just as they come from the box.

Eighty percent of adjustable chairs are never completely readjusted after the initial set-up. Chairs with the potential for perfect seating fail to deliver because of their complexity.

4. Typical answers to the problem of unadjusted chairs don't work very well.

User Manuals are complicated and time consuming (some one-half inch thick). Manuals get lost or misplaced.

Training sessions are temporarily effective but, – turnover (average six months), shift changes or other population changes (conference rooms, class rooms, computer labs etc) and lack of employee interest keep training from working well.

5. Triune solves the problem by simply eliminating it rather that adapting to it.

If adjusting creates problems, let the chair do the adjusting automatically when you sit down. Lumbar support automatically adjusts to the contours of the person using the chair. Back angle adjusts to the posture preference of the user. Seat front yields to pressure and eliminates circulation problems or numbness.

6. Options are available.

Special arms with horizontal and vertical adjustment and luxury mechanical controls allow additional customization of Triune's chairs.

7. Self-Adjusting chairs are no more expensive (and in many cases, much less expensive) than the complicated chairs commonly used.
